

Policy Statement - Student Achievement

<u>Purpose</u>

To provide all students for the program of learning, based on requirements of New Zealand curriculum.

- 1. The curriculum plan will be the basis of all teaching and learning programs.
- 2. It is expected all accompanying procedures will be adhered to.
- 3. Cooperative planning and teaching between teachers is expected.
- 4. Long term planning is coordinated by the Deputy Principal, Curriculum Leaders and syndicate leaders. Daily planning is the responsibility of each teacher.
- Teaching programs will be planned according to class or group or individual needs, identified through ongoing monitoring and assessment.
- 6. Staff development will be based on school goals, targets and identified teacher need, from appraisal procedures.

The following procedures are documented as part of this policy and include:

- Curriculum plan
- Homework
- Special needs/ gifted and talented students
- Assessment and Testing

Homework Procedures

- At the beginning of each year, all teachers will hold last meeting for parents and students, to outline expectations for homework.
- Homework should consist of reading, spelling, basic facts in maths, and any learning activities relevant to individual student needs and abilities.
- Homework should be an opportunity to practice previous learnt work.
- Guideline, the maximum time for new entrant to year 3 student should be 15 minutes per night and a maximum of 30 minutes per night for a year 4 to 6 student.

Procedures for provisions of support for special needs / gifted and talented students

- The principal will work possibly with class teachers and support staff, to identify and provide appropriate programs for students with extra learning needs.
- Year 3 to 6 students fitting this category will have an IEP prepared and reviewed once a term.
- Relevant training and support will be provided when available and when the need arises.
- Students require extra support will be referred to the appropriate agency, ie GS, BEST team, RTLB, CAFS, GATE

Assessment and training procedures

- All children will be tested on the JOST test and aspects of the observation survey, and numeracy knowledge after one month at school.
- All children will be tested after 6 months at school and the results graphed.
 (Observational survey)
- At the end of each year all children will be tested on the numeracy project and the results sent into the project directors, for comparison against the national scores.
- all children from you 3 and above will be tested in Term 4 in spelling (PRETOS), reading (running records), and written language will be leveled against the asttle and the exemplars.
